At Sea

Yesterday we left Punta Arenas, Chile and are on our way to Puerto Montt, Chile which is 1089 nautical miles and the required speed is 18.6 knots. This morning around 11:15 we started sailing through the Chilean fjords, while entering the South Pacific Ocean (Very Rough). At about 12:40 we passed "Islote Negro" on the starboard side of the ship. At about 17:30 the famous Glacier "El Brujo" was visible and later in the evening we were out of the fjords and sailing through the South Pacific Ocean. The sea was very rough this morning, heavy winds, large swells. Most of us stayed in our cabins until later in the day when things settled down, the elevators on the ship were even shut down. This morning reminded me of when I was in the Navy and we were off the coast of Guam and in a Typhoon, we would sink so low the port holes were under water, but we always bounced back up, just like today. Because of the rough weather no production in the Theatre this evening. Laying in bed was like when you have a baby in a cradle and you were rocked back and forth, well today the sea did it for all of us. The Glacier does not look that big in the pictures but it was really, really, big and very cold outside.
