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Bali has its own language - one of 583 languages and dialects spoken in the Indonesian archipelago. Bahasa Indonesia is the national language: english is widely spoken in Bali's main tourist areas. It is home to approximately 4 1/2 million people. The vast majority follows a special version of Hinduism, different to that practiced in India, and witnessing the rituals and ceremonies of daily life is a highlight of visiting the island. The island is home to more than 20,000 temples, earning its nickname "the island of a thousand temples" or "the island of the gods".

Bali has just two seasons: Dry season (April to October), and Wet season (October to April). The overall temperature remains moderate across Bali as the island enjoys a tropical climate. The Island is known for it's stunning white sand beaches, and thanks to the active volcances on Bali, there are beaches that have pure black sand.

We spent two days in Bali and I had so much fun on the first day visiting the Monkey Forest I went back the second day.
