You'll be dropped at the Suria KLCC Shopping Mall (also your later pick-up point) and then it's up to you.

Snapshot-worthy spots include the gorgeous Moorish railway building, the clock tower of the Sultan Abdul Samad Building, the world's tallest flagpole and the Royal Selangor Club on Independence Square along with many others.


Shopping opportunities can be found at the Sungei Wang Plaza, Bukit Bintang Plaza, and the Lot 10 Shopping Complex.
