Petra originates from the Greek word "Petros" meaning rocks. It is also known as Al-Batra in Arabic. Petra became a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1985 as well as one of the New Seven Wonders of the World in 2007. Petra is also called the "Rose City" due to the color of its rocks, which take on a red-pink hue at sunset and sunrise. The entrance to the city of Petra is by a narrow passage cut through the sandstone as a result of years of rain and wind. This passage is known as the "Siq", which simply means "Gorge". Only 15 percent is currently being investigated by archaeologists and the remainder has yet to be discovered.

We moored in at the port of Aqaba about 7:00 and departed around 19:00 and headed to the Suez Canal. We had 30 buses from the ship going to Petra.
