We continued navigation in the Red Sea, at around 12:00 at the port side of the ship we had Daedalus Reef at a distance of 17 nautical miles. Daedalus Reef (Also known as Abu Kizan) is a 400-meter-long and 100-meter-wide standalone reef in the Egyptian Red Sea situated about 90 kilometers from Marsa Alam. There is a small artificial island in the centre of the reef, which hosts a lighthouse. Daedalus reef is a well-known place for diving.

Around midnight we sailed in the strait between the Final Peninsula at a distance of 2 nautical miles and the Island of Tiran at a distance of .2 nautical miles.

## **AQABA**

Aqaba is the only coastal city in Jordan and the largest and most populous city on the Gulf of Aqaba. Situated in southernmost Jordan, Aqaba is the administrative centre of the Aqaba Governorate.

Today, Aqaba plays a major role in the development of the Jordanian economy, through the vibrant trade and tourism sectors.

Inhabited since 4000 B.C., it's home to the Islamic-era Aqaba Fort. Its beach resorts are popular for windsurfing and other water sports, and the area is a top destination for scuba divers, with notable dive sites including the Yamanieh coral reef in the Aqaba Marine Park, south of the city.
